Plan, Participate: Our First Working Meeting

36 children from across Europe, aged 10-17, gathered in Brussels on June 27-28 to take part in our first working meeting.

The event was co-organised and co-facilitated by the Children's Panel. Children came together to review the work over the last two years and discuss topics for the next Work Plan.

The children took part in a variety of activities, discussing topics such as poverty and inclusion, well-being and education, safety online and cyberbullying, climate change, and funding. They had the chance to share ideas and present their inputs to the whole group.

On 23 April 2024, the European Commission's Recommendation on Integrated Child Protection Services was published. Through our Platform, over 1,000 children shared their ideas on what they need to feel safe, many of which are reflected in the recommendation. - Initiative: Children from Bremore School, Ireland, teamed up with the European Commission to create child-friendly digital principles. They simplified complex policies into easy-to-understand language and suggested visual improvements. <u>Know more</u>.
- **Call**: Since 2016, over 1,700 young people from more than 30 countries have joined the <u>Young European Ambassadors (YEAs)</u> initiative. They lead fun activities like social media campaigns and school visits. YEAs can meet top EU officials and join policy discussions. It's a great chance

for older teens in your networks to volunteer, build careers, and make friends across borders!

- **Call**: Missing Children Europe needs 5 to 7 members aged 15 to 24. If you have ever run away, been forced to leave your home, been in migration, been an unaccompanied minor, or have been abducted or trafficked, they want to hear from you.
